

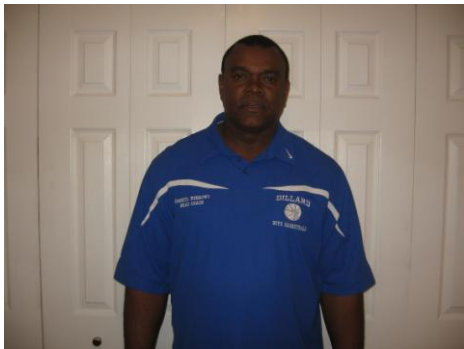


McDonald's All American Games 2009 Coach Bios



Mark Lieberman - Boys East
Monsignor Pace High School (Miami, Fla.)

Coach Lieberman has enjoyed 12 seasons as Head Coach of the Spartans and holds a 305-77 career record. Lieberman led his team to State Championships in 1999, 2003, 2007 and 2008 and thus far no other high school basketball team in the state of Florida has won more games than his team. His teams have also made four Florida State Final Four appearances and ten consecutive District Championship appearances. Coach Lieberman has been recognized as the Miami Herald Coach of the Year four times, the Florida Dairy Farmers Coach of the Year twice and has had the opportunity to serve as Head Coach in numerous All-Star events, such as the Kentucky Derby Festival and Dade/Broward All-Star Games.



Darryl Burrows - Boys East
Dillard High School (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.)

Coach Burrows holds a record of 391-93 as the head coach of Dillard High School. With five Florida State Championships under his belt, Coach Burrows has proven that he is one of the top high school coaches in the State of Florida. Burrows has been named Coach of the Year five times by the *Miami Herald*, has carried his teams to nine district titles, eight regional titles, eight state appearances and five State Championships. Burrows has also been named the Broward County Athletic Association Coach of the Year for 1999-2000 (Southern Division) and the Florida Dairy Farmers 5A Boys Basketball Coach of the Year for 2007-2008.



Pat Clatchey - Boys West
Mount Saint Joseph High School (Baltimore, Md.)

Coach Clatchey has served as the head basketball coach at Mount Saint Joseph High School for 17 seasons. He's led his team to 13 straight seasons of 20 wins or more, averaged 30 wins a season over the past seven years and holds the Maryland state record for most wins in a season with 38. Clatchey has also claims the most wins and championships in the Baltimore Metro area during the past decade, is a six-time Baltimore Catholic Coach of the Year, three-time Baltimore Metro Coach of the Year and three-time Baltimore City Coach of the Year. Clatchey has developed 22 Division 1 student athletes, holds five Baltimore Catholic League regular season championships, three Baltimore Catholic League Tournament Championships and has the most wins and championships in the Baltimore Metro area in the past decade.



Abby Ward - Girls East
South Broward High School (Hollywood, Fla.)

Coach Ward started her career in education and coaching at Boyd H. Anderson High School in Lauderdale Lakes, FL. Under her direction, the Women's Track and Field team collected three State Championships and the J.V. Basketball program enjoyed four undefeated seasons, while she served as an assistant.

Coach Ward's move to South Broward High School in 1991 marked the start of her ultimate success as a Head Basketball Coach. She has led the Bulldogs to five State Championships, ten Regional Championships, ten District Championships and three BCAA Championships. She has received Coach of the Year honors from the FACA (2001, 2003), the Sun Sentinel (1998, 2001, 2003), and the Miami Herald (2001, 2002). She has been selected to coach in two All-Star events prior to the McDonald's All American Game (2000 Broward County All-Stars and the 2005 BCAA North All-Stars).

For her excellence in coaching and mentorship to the youth of Southern Florida, Coach Ward was inducted into the Broward County Sports Hall of Fame in 2001.



Dave Power - Girls West
Fenwick High School (Oak Park, Ill.)

The 2009 basketball season marks Coach Power's 17th as Head Coach of the Fenwick Friars and his 33rd season coaching high school basketball overall. Power has compiled an impressive career winning percentage of .790 and is currently recognized as the second winningest girl's basketball coach in the state of Illinois. Coach Power holds a career record of 751-199 and led his teams to Illinois State Championships in 1987, 2001 and 2007. His teams have also made four State Final Four appearances and three State Elite Eight appearances, and have been crowned Regional Champions 13 times and East Suburban Catholic League Champions 14 times. Coach Power also coached AAU basketball, where he led the Illinois Hustle to a 1995 National Championship in the U14 Division. Power has helped develop 35 players who have played or are currently playing in Division 1 College programs. For all of his coaching success and dedication to his student athletes, Coach Power has been inducted into the East Suburban Catholic Conference Hall of Fame (2006), the Girls Catholic Athletic Conference Hall of Fame (2005) and the Illinois Basketball Coaches Association Hall of Fame (2005).
